Under the 3 criteria for control, I believe Introduced predator species applies and meets all 3 criteria, and would be the most effective at invasive species reduction. We have several native fish, that prey on the current invasives and would also feed on juvenile asian carp. the invasive species interrupt recruitment, we merely have to provide a safe spawning/nursery area. At present there is no risk of having too many native fish, and lack of predators is the main reason all invasives thrive. Native Predators are a safe natural control, we are shovel ready, and require no funding at this time, only permission to proceed.
