Restoration of Native Perch which would feed on eggs larvae and juvenile Asian Carp, and they also eat the mussels and most of the other invasives. They are also natural prey for other native predators. They have a large mouth gape as well. Being native any native food they eat after reductions in invasive fodder, would be natural. Invasives are blocking Perch (and other native) recruitment. Stocking and/or safe zones can be created for more consistant spawn survival, at low cost. Creel limits reduced, close during spawn (free). This would not interfere with any other Asian Carp or ANS plans. There is no logical reason to wait to do this.
